He was born in 1957 and claims to have kept a rather low profile at the College, as a day boy coming in each morning from Cretingham.

After graduating from Reading University he wrote to every suitable newspaper he could find asking for a job. The Editor of the East Anglian Daily Times (EADT), whose chair he would one day occupy, personally telephoned him at Reading and he started at Bury St Edmonds as a junior reporter.
