After leaving the College he got in radio and has worked at Kestrel FM in Basingstoke, Kick FM in Newbury and has freelanced for numerous BBC and commercial radio stations around the UK.

For the last 5 years, he has been waking up thousands of Radio Broadland listeners in Norfolk and Suffolk as breakfast show newsreader/presenter. He is also the station's news editor and heads up a team of journalist at Radio Broadland.

Despite his 4o'clock starts, he is always bright and cheery on-air and still fresh 10 hours later. He has worked on stories including the recent Ipswich murders, bird flu in Norfolk and North Suffolk and the closure of New Jarrold Printing in Norwich. His professional approach enables him to swing effortlessly from serious hard news to light hearted stories.

He was named Journalist of the Year 2006 at the Creative East Awards and a finalist in the 2007 awards.

He is part of "The Morning Crew" when he is apparently referred to as "Posh Harry" because of his privileged up bringing. As such he is the butt of many jokes from his co presenters, Rob and Chrissie.
